Welcome to Worship

We are glad to have you in worship and we are glad to worship together. Following governmental directives and in the interest of providing a healthy environment for all who come, we are implementing a number of changes to our **worship routine**:

- Everyone is encouraged to wear masks as you come inside the building
(*masks will be provided if you do not have your own*)
- Hand sanitizers are available near the entrance of each worship area.
- Please maintain social distance from one another.
- Greeters will not shake hands.
- Please pick up your own bulletin.

Seating:

- Pews in the church are taped off to keep a safe distance. Chairs in the activity center will be distanced, and couples and families can be together.

For Holy Communion:

- Worshippers will approach with masks on and with social distancing.
- The Pastor and elders will sanitize their hands and wear masks.

After the benediction:

- Those closest to the exit will leave first, followed in order by the rest.

Offering plates and Fellowship Registrations will not be passed.

- Please place Fellowship Registrations and Offerings in the plate near the entrance.

Online recordings of each Sunday's service will continue to be provided, though the actual broadcast will be delayed by one week.

New Online Bible Study Sunday at 7pm: Return to the Lord is the theme as we explore the last three books of the Old Testament. Pastor Rich Mokry leads this 45-minute study. This bible study is designed not only for members, but also for new friends, both near and far. Look for a link in our weekly email.

Look at our Pews: Craftsmen came in altered our pews so 6 people with wheel-chairs or walkers can worship comfortably in our sanctuary. We have also reduced our mortgage debt. These efforts are made possible through our contributions to the Fulfilling the Mission of Hope Campaign. As contributions come in, we will continue other parts of our campaign, like creating a more user-friendly ramp, calling a youth worker, and adding technology to or sanctuary.
